

Fun Fact: 811, the Derby and the Stakes

Common Ground Alliance

sponsored jockey, Victor Espinoza, increased 811 awareness by wearing "Call 811" on his pants, turtleneck and boots during the Kentucky Derby and the Preakness Stakes.

811 was once again part of the Kentucky Derby as 811sponsored jockey, Victor



Espinoza rode American Pharoah in the Run for the Roses virtual horserace May 2. This was the first time since World War II that the Kentucky Derby didn't run on the first Saturday in May, so NBC and Churchill Downs created a virtual race between all 13 Triple Crown winners, with fans donating to COVID-19 relief. Churchill Downs was hoping to raise \$2M and pledged a match of \$1 million to the donations. The race was simulated using past and present handicapping and statistics.

Much of the focus was on American Pharoah and the Derby-victory start to his Triple Crown run in 2015. American Pharaoh, ridden by 811-sponsored jockey Victor Espinoza, was a 6-1 morning pick who won the 141st Kentucky Derby with American Pharoah in Louisville, KY on May 2, 2015. That race was also rebroadcast as part of the Kentucky Derby special airing on May 2, 2020.

Although the derby was virtual, the excitement was real as Secretariat, who was the favorite pick at 7-2, crossed the finish line to win ahead of the other 12 Triple Crown winners. American Pharoah finished fifth.


It was a way to celebrate an annual tradition with fans and communities and join together for a great cause. 811 was proud to be a part of the fundraising event!

MISS DIG 811 website to place an e-Locate

Just a few things to remember when placing an e-Locate:

- Must wait 3 business days for locating before beginning scheduled work
- One address per ticket
- Scope of work must stay within that address
- Must have one cross street that is different than street of address
- Use the proper abbreviation with location name, example: ST, RD, AVE, CT, LN, BLVD...
- Add location information for newer addresses in the additional comments
